## A message from the Chair of Llancarfan Community Council:

Every January, the Community Council needs to set the amount of revenue that needs to be raised to help meet running costs for the forthcoming year across the community and so the council will issue a request for a contribution, which is known as the local 'Precept'.

The LCC works out the income required for the forthcoming year in the form of a Budget. The budget is based on previous year's expenditure, anticipated costs (including inflation), extra increased costs for products and services, changes in legislation, repairs etc. This is then converted into an amount per Council Tax Band that is added onto the general Council Tax demand. We have slightly increased our precept request this year and are requesting a total of £13,600. The last two years the precept has remained the same at £12,350, which is divided between all residents who are liable to pay council tax. The budget of £13,600 is divided by the number of Band D properties and calculates as £2.57 per household per year, or £0.21 per month, or £0.05 per week, for properties in Band D. Residents in Bands A-C will pay less and those in receipt of Council Tax Support will be unaffected. We would like to reassure our communities that the proposed increase is not taken lightly and that all monies managed by the LCC are used for the good of all the local communities.
