## Christmas recycling

There will be **no black bag restrictions** between Tuesday 27 December 2022 and Friday 13 January 2023. Black bags will still be collected on a fortnightly basis during this time. The normal limit of 2 black bags per household will resume on Monday 16 January 2023. Christmas trees will be collected from designated collection points from Monday 16 January 2023 to Saturday 28 January 2023.

- Only real trees can be collected for recycling
- Remove any decorations and soil
- If longer than 6 foot, please cut down to size
